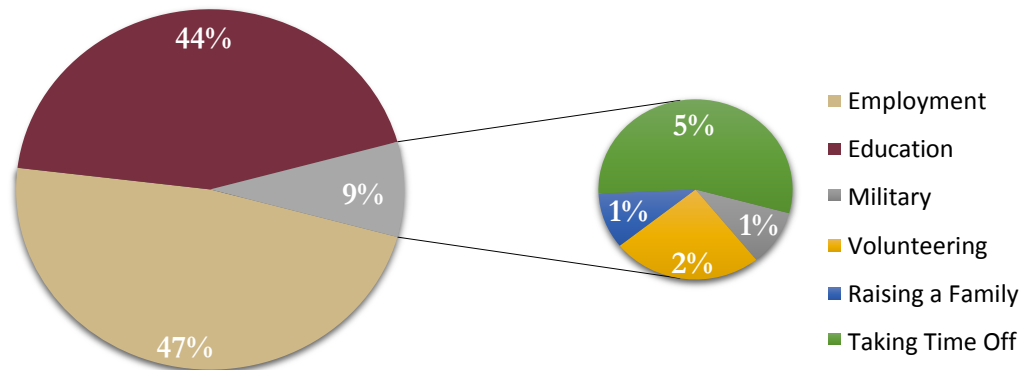


Graduating Seniors: Psychology

The Career Center, in conjunction with the Division of Student Affairs and Institutional Research, has administered a survey to graduating seniors for over a decade, asking students about their post-college plans and their overall FSU experience. Of all the Department of Psychology graduates from Summer 2013, Fall 2013, and Spring 2014, 470 graduates participated (91%). The data presented in this report are based on responses to the Graduating Senior Survey at the point of graduation with data on employment and continuing education outcomes updated for graduates who responded to the six-month follow-up survey.

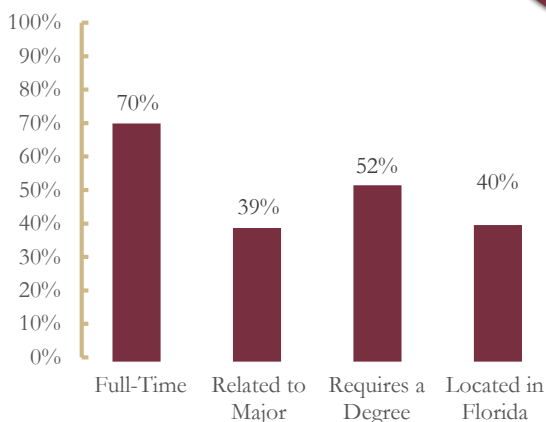
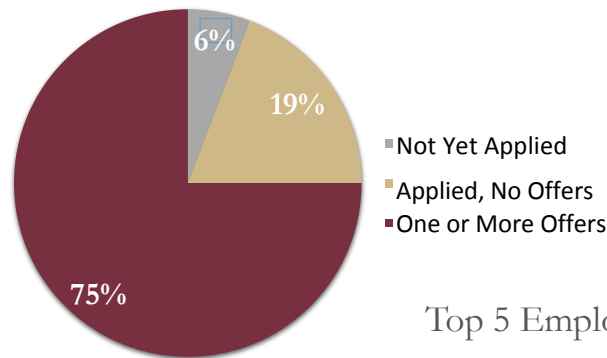
Psychology Post-Graduation Plans

Data indicate that over two-fifths of Psychology graduates are pursuing further education after graduation, and almost one half are seeking employment.

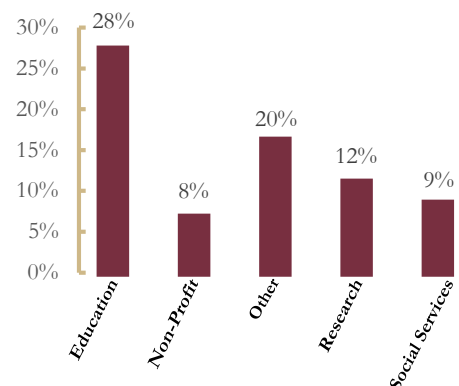


Psychology Post-Graduation Employment

Over three-fourths of graduates whose primary plan was employment received at least one offer of employment and are employed in a wide variety of industries. Also, Psychology graduates most frequently found jobs that were full-time and required a degree.

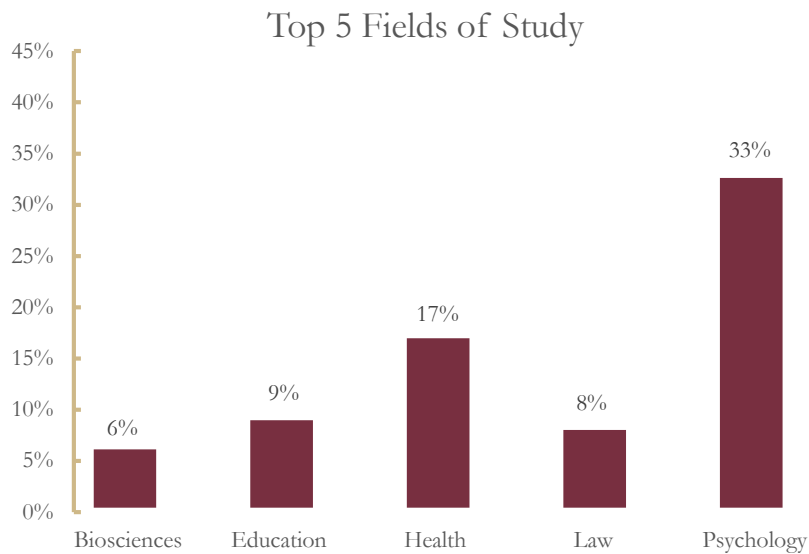
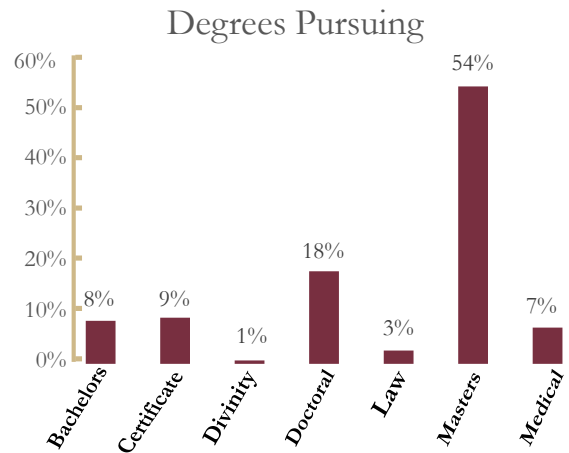
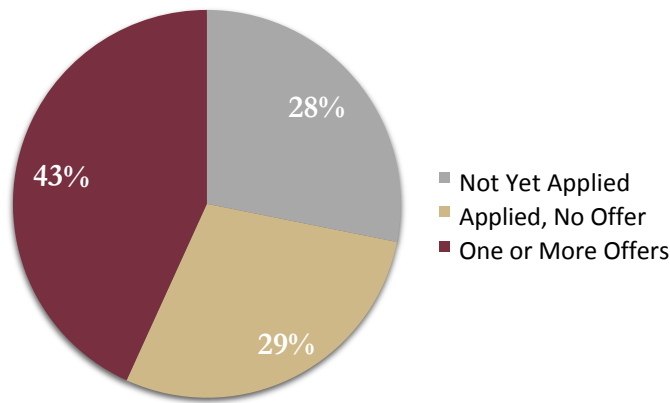


Top 5 Employment Industries



Psychology Post-Graduation Education

More than four-fifths of graduates whose primary plan was to continue their education in Spring 2014 received at least one offer of acceptance at a college or university and are studying in a wide variety of fields.



Psychology Student Characteristics

Psychology graduates have success both inside and outside of the classroom, and participate in various extracurricular activities.

Professional Experience

46% of graduates completed an internship

Giving Back

71% of graduates participated in community service

Campus Involvement

93% of graduates participated in one or more campus activities

Research Experience

34% of graduates participated in a research project

Global Experience

10% of graduates participated in study abroad

Academic Excellence

15% of graduates participated in the honors program
