
College of Criminology

The Career Center, in conjunction with the Division of Student Affairs and Institutional Research, has administered a survey to graduating seniors for over a decade, asking students about their post-college plans and their overall FSU experience. Of all the College of Criminology graduates from Summer 2014, Fall 2014, and Spring 2015, 513 graduates participated. The data presented in this report are based on responses to the Graduating Senior Survey at the point of graduation with data on employment and continuing education outcomes updated for graduates who responded to the six-month follow-up survey.


Post-Graduation Plans

Data indicate that around one-quarter of Criminology graduates are pursuing further education after graduation, and over one half are seeking employment.





Post-Graduation Employment

Over one half of graduates whose primary plan was employment received at least one offer of employment and are employed in a wide variety of industries. Also, Criminology graduates most frequently found jobs that were full-time.





