

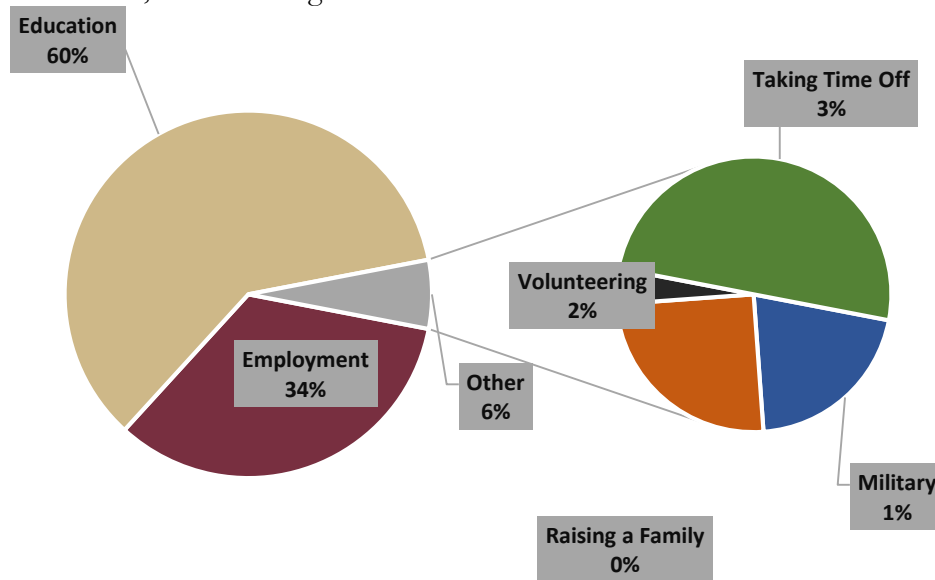

### Department of Nutrition, Food and Exercise Sciences

The Career Center, in conjunction with the Division of Student Affairs and Institutional Research, has administered a survey to graduating seniors for over a decade, asking students about their post-college plans and their overall FSU experience. Of all the Department of Nutrition, Food and Exercise Sciences graduates from Summer 2014, Fall 2014, and Spring 2015, 397 graduates participated. The data presented in this report are based on responses to the Graduating Senior Survey at the point of graduation with data on employment and continuing education outcomes updated for graduates who responded to the six-month follow-up survey.

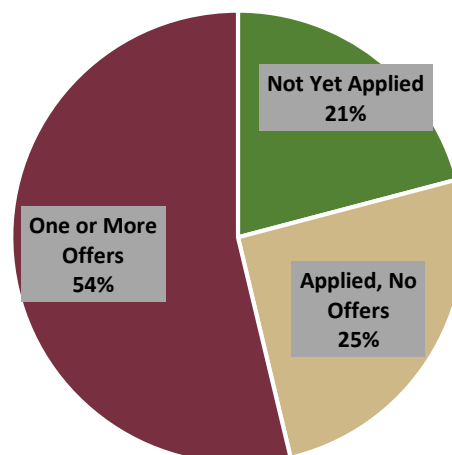
#### Post-Graduation Plans

The following represents the primary plan indicated by the student after graduation, whether it be seeking employment, further education, or something else.



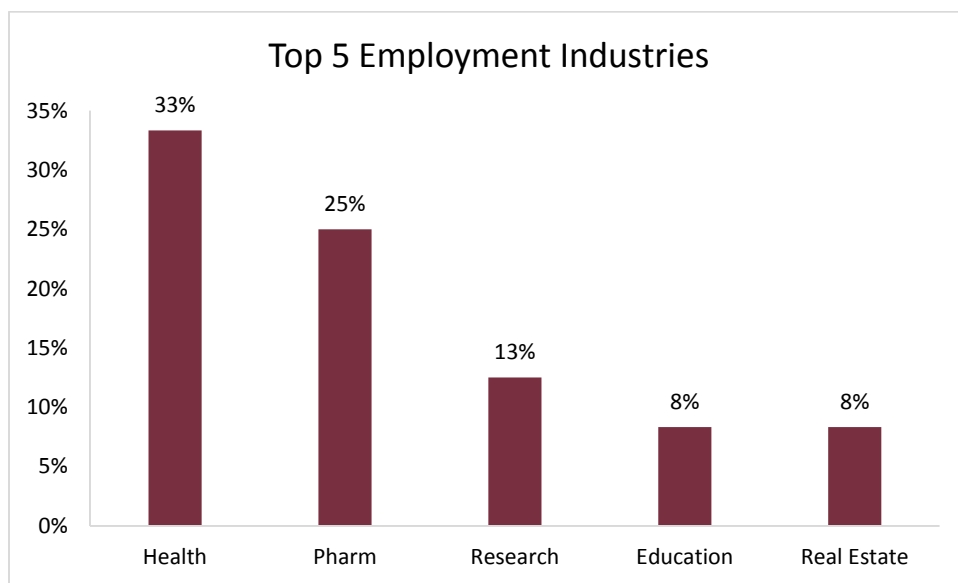
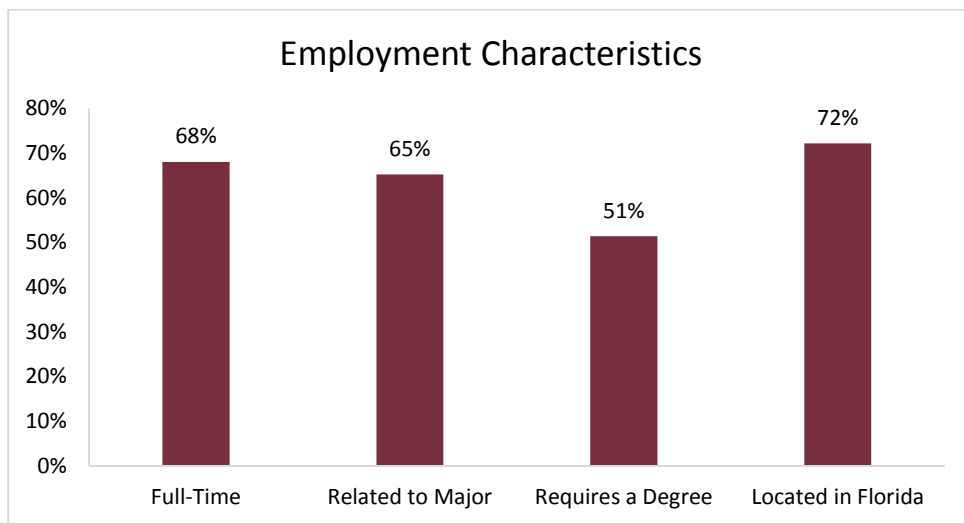
#### Post-Graduation Employment

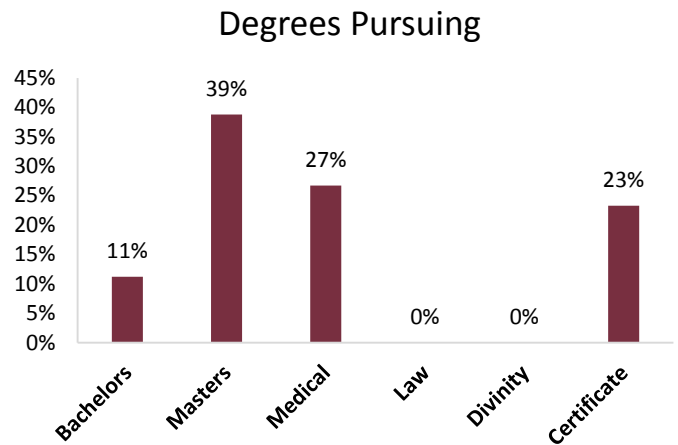
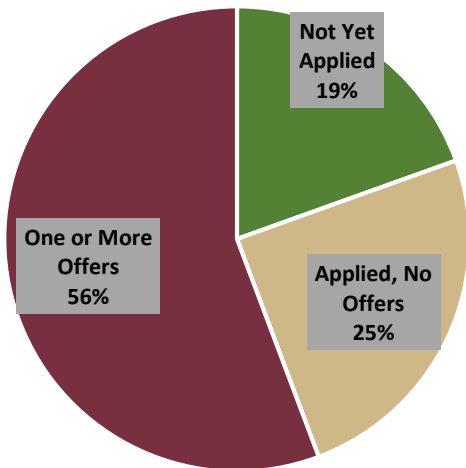

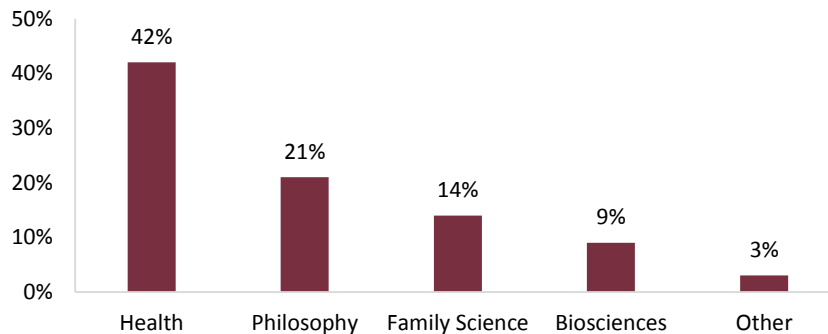
