Profile

Overview

Florida State University is a public, fully accredited, coeducational institution, and is one of twelve institutions of the Florida State University System directed by the Florida Board of Governors. Located in Tallahassee, Florida's capital city, the university affords students and faculty opportunities for interaction with state and federal agencies for internships, research, and part-time employment, as well as a myriad of social, cultural, and recreational activities. The main campus is located on 487.6 acres in Tallahassee with other facilities owned in Leon, Bay, Collier, Franklin, Gadsden, and Sarasota counties. Sites are leased in various counties in Florida and other locations overseas.

Across FSU's 17 colleges, students can pursue:

- Baccalaureate degrees: 201 active majors in 100 degree programs
- Master's degrees: 224 active majors in 101 degree programs
- Specialist degrees: 17 active majors in 6 degree programs
- Doctoral degrees: 129 active majors in 64 degree programs
- Professional degrees: 8 active majors in 4 degree programs

The academic divisions are the Colleges of Applied Studies; Arts and Sciences; Business (Herbert Wertheim); Communication and Information; Criminology and Criminal Justice; Education, Health, and Human Sciences (Anne Spencer Daves); Engineering; Entrepreneurship (Jim Moran); Fine Arts; Hospitality (Dedman); Law; Medicine; Motion Picture Arts; Music; Nursing; Social Sciences and Public Policy; and Social Work.

Of enrolled students, 80.5 percent attend full time. Undergraduates comprise 71.6 percent and graduate students 23.9 percent of the total enrollment of 46,184 students in the Fall of 2025 (4.5% are unclassified). The average age of all students is 22.9; of undergraduates, 20.5; and of graduate students, 30.4.

Tallahassee/ Leon County Statistics

According to United States Census estimates, the population of Florida in 2025 was 23,462,518. In 2024, the population of Leon County was 300,488; ranking 23rd most populous among Florida counties. Tallahassee is the 9th most populous city in Florida, with 205,089 people in 2024. Leon County is tied for the most educated county in Florida, with 48.6% of residents holding at least a Bachelor's degree.

A Brief History of Florida State University

Florida State University was established as the Seminary West of the Suwannee by an act of the Florida Legislature in 1851 and first offered instruction at the postsecondary level in 1857. Its Tallahassee campus has been the site of an institution of higher education longer than any other site in the state. In 1905, the Buckman Act reorganized higher education in the state and designated the Tallahassee school as the Florida Female College. In 1909, it was renamed Florida State College for Women. In 1947, the school returned to co-educational status, and the name was changed to Florida State University. It has grown from an enrollment of 2,583 in 1946 to an enrollment of 46,184 in 2025.

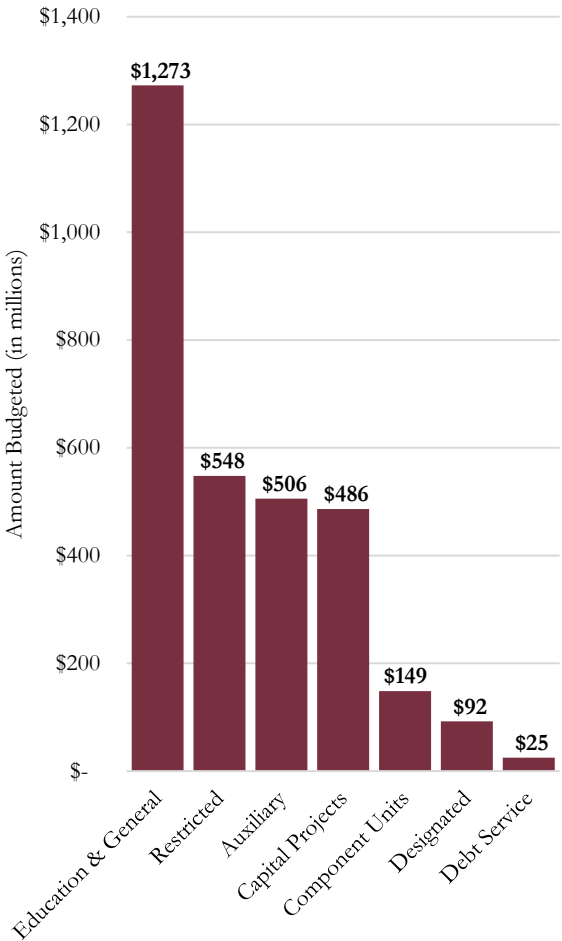

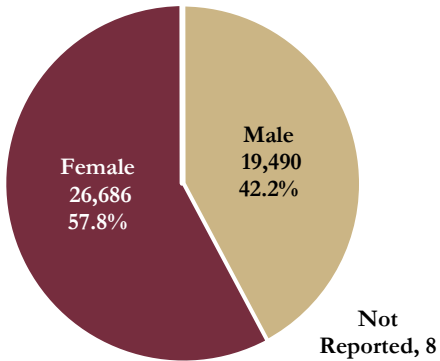
Student Characteristics, Fall 2025

- Enrollment was 46,184: 33,068 (71.6%) undergraduates, 11,022 (23.9%) graduate/professional, 2,094 (4.5%) unclassified
- 80.0% of all students were Floridians; 94.1% were from the United States
- Eighteen Florida counties contributed over 500 students each: Leon, Miami-Dade, Broward, Hillsborough, Palm Beach, Orange, Duval, Pinellas, St. Johns, Bay, Seminole, Sarasota, Brevard, Pasco, Lee, Collier, Manatee, Volusia
- Students hailed from all 50 states and the District of Columbia. Nineteen states contributed 100+ students each: Florida, Georgia, New Jersey, New York, Texas, Illinois, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Virginia, Tennessee, California, Maryland, Ohio, Massachusetts, Alabama, Colorado, South Carolina, Missouri, & Connecticut
- Students came from 133 non-U.S. countries or territories, seventeen of which contributed 40+ students: Panama, China, India, South Korea, Brazil, Bangladesh, Venezuela, Nigeria, Canada, Japan, Colombia, Vietnam, United Kingdom, Ghana, Iran, Jamaica, & Pakistan
- Women accounted for 57.8% of total enrollment
- Racial minorities made up 39.4% of the student enrollment who reported ethnicity. Of those 17,917 students, 56.5% were Hispanic, 21.5% Black, 10.1% Asian, 0.3% American Indian/Native Alaskan, 0.1% Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, 11.5% Two or More Races
- International students comprised 5.8% of the 46,184 students enrolled in Fall 2025; 1.5% of students did not report ethnicity
- Average age of all students was 22.9; of undergraduates, 20.5; of graduates, 30.4; of unclassified students, 22.4
- Full-time students represented 80.5% of students
- The middle 50% high school GPA for the Summer/Fall 2025 first-time-in-college (FTIC) class was 4.1-4.5; middle 50% SAT scores, 1300-1410; middle 50% ACT composite scores, 29-32
- 85,469 applications were received for students applying for admission as FTIC students in Summer/Fall 2025; 20,364 were admitted and 6,559 enrolled
- In Fall 2025, there were 155 National Merit Scholars enrolled. Of these undergraduates, 59 were 2025 FTICs.

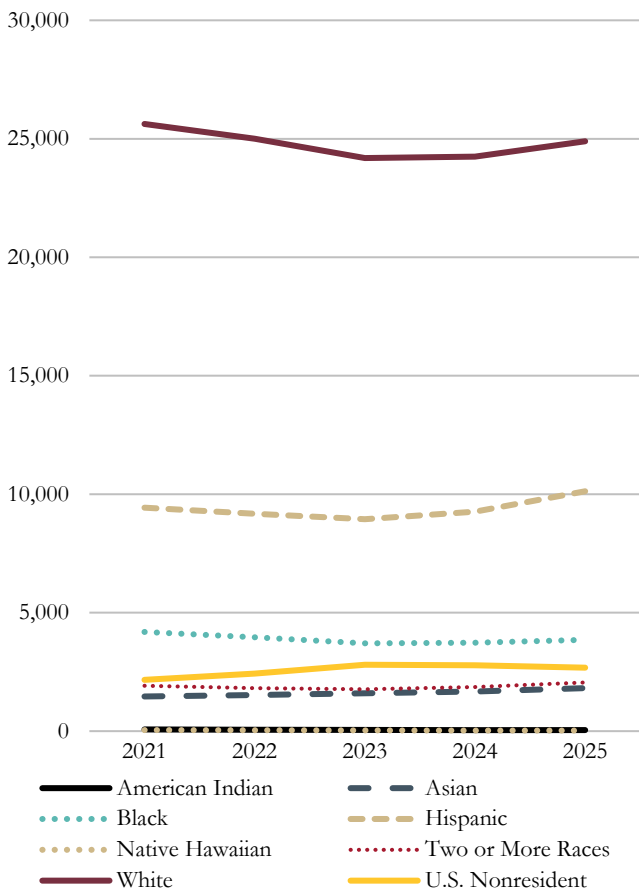

Headcount Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity

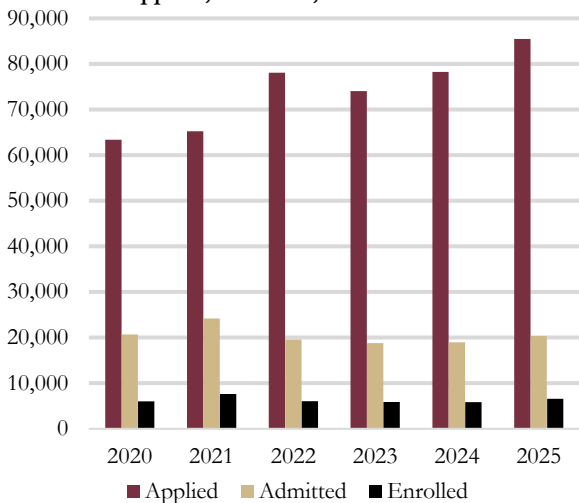

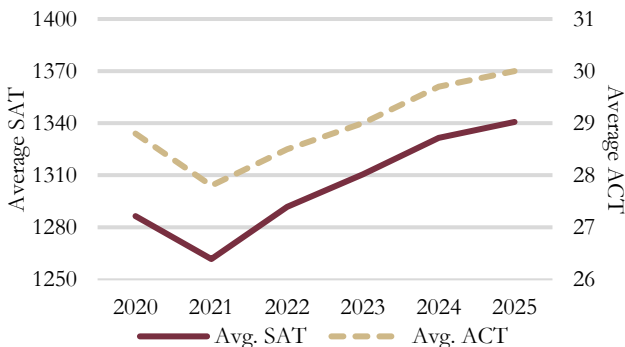

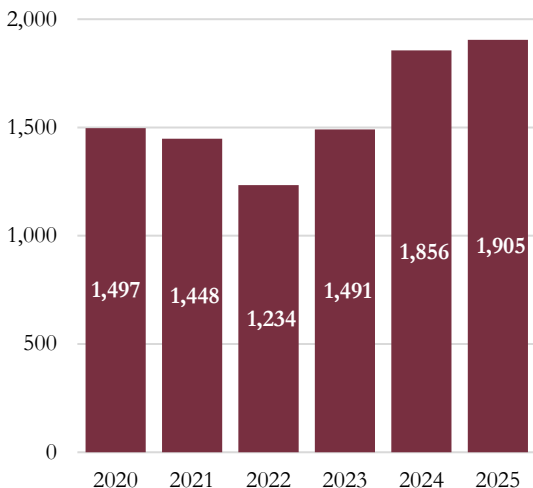

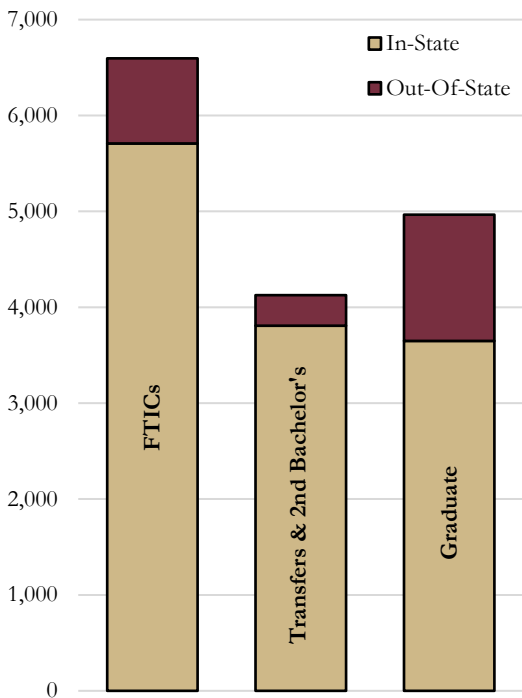

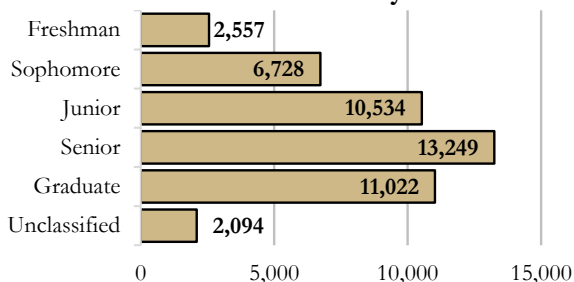

Fall 2025 Headcount by Class



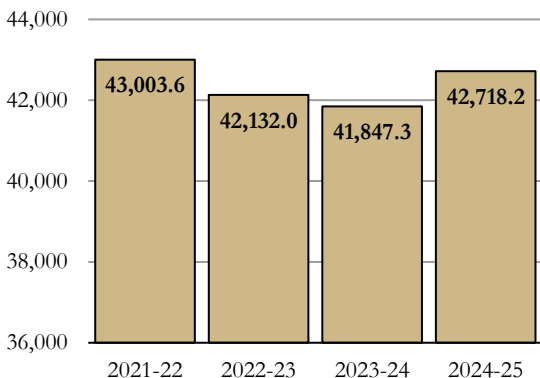

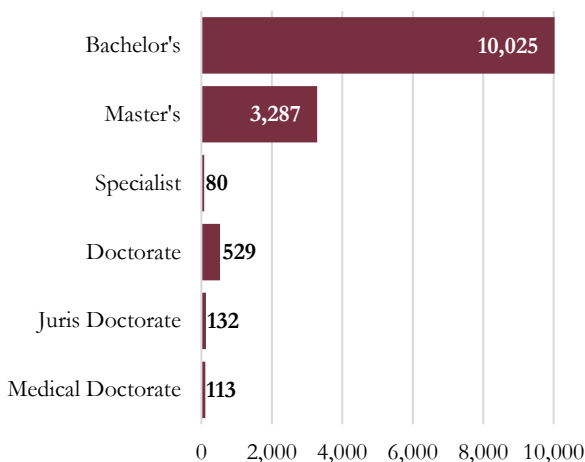

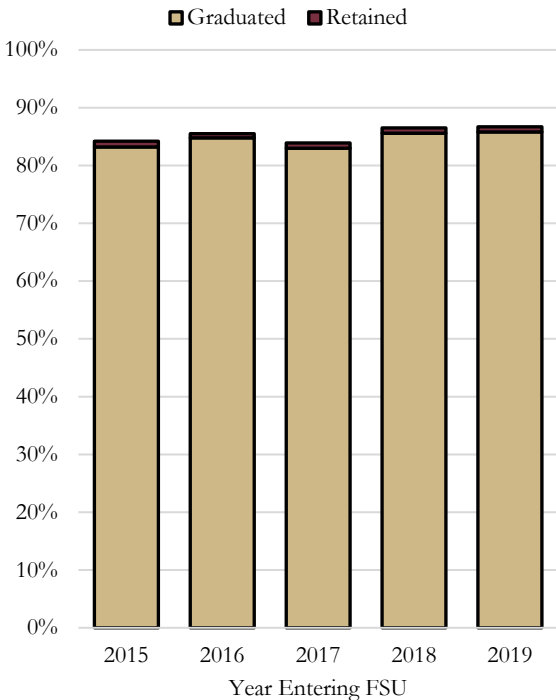

University Libraries

University Libraries provide collections, resources, and services to enhance the learning, teaching, and research of Florida State University. The Libraries' collections include over 5.8 million titles, and the website offers access to 803 databases and more than 236,453 electronic journals. Materials not available online or at the Libraries may be requested through interlibrary loan or the statewide UBorrow system, offering FSU faculty and students access to millions of books from 39 other state universities and college libraries. The Library Express Delivery Service (LEDS) delivers daily.

University Libraries had over 1.1 million visitors in the last fiscal year 2024-25. Typically, Strozier Library, FSU's largest library, is open 140 hours each week to provide research assistance and a full range of academic support throughout the day and into the evening. Students and faculty can choose learning spaces, from the Bradley Reading Room to the Starbucks coffee shop of the first-floor Learning Commons. Library faculty offers classes and consultations to teach critical research and thinking skills. For distant learners and other off-campus library users, online research services are available, and the library staff offers outreach services across campus.

The FSU Libraries include the following: the Robert Manning Strozier Library, Paul A. M. Dirac Science Library, Mildred and Claude Pepper Library, the FAMU-FSU College of Engineering Library, and FSU Panama City – Florida Library and Learning Center. The following are designated dean-directed libraries: Warren Allen Music Library, College of Law Legal Research Center, College of Medicine Medical Library, and the John & Mable Ringling Museum of Art Library in Sarasota. International Programs study centers in London, Florence, Valencia, and Panama also provide library services and spaces.

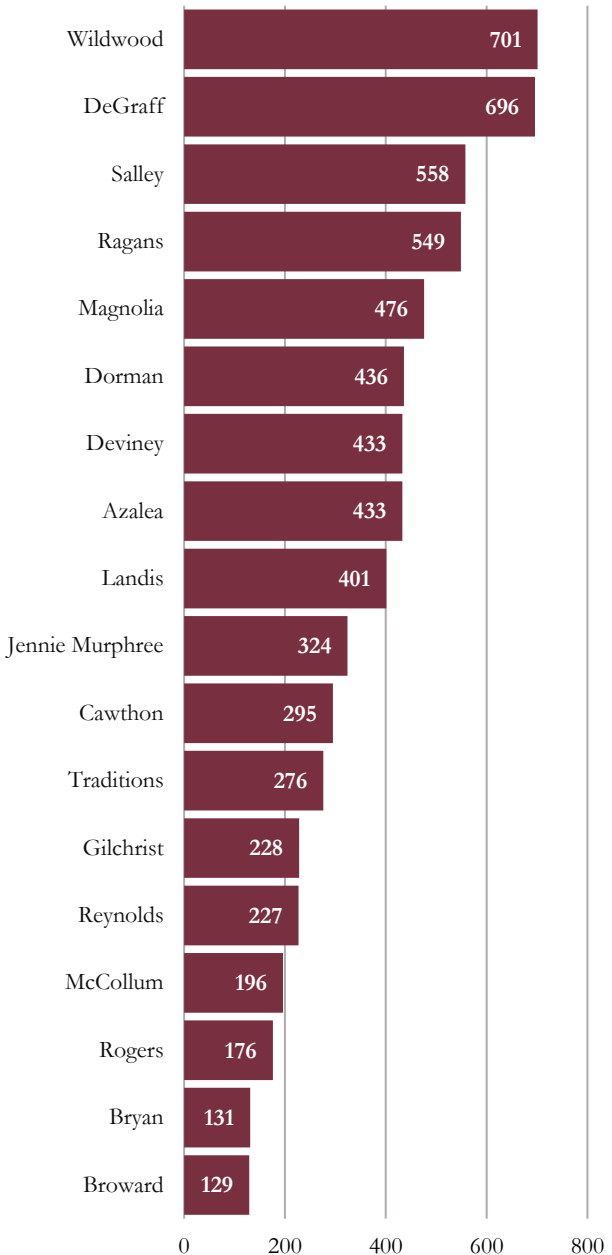
